This is **not** an ALSA-sanctioned show.

Entries must be received/postmarked by June 28, 2002. This includes a copy of your rabies certificate for each animal. No animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds unless rabies certificates are already in the Superintendent's possession. **This will be strictly enforced.**

General Rules

1. No smoking in the tent/arena.
2. Proof of rabies vaccination is required for each animal entered and must be on file with the Superintendent. A copy of the health certificate must accompany your animal onto the fairgrounds – **no** exceptions.
3. The judge or Superintendent has the option to dismiss any exhibitor with an unruly or mishandled animal.
4. The number of pens available is limited; therefore, only 1 pen per farm will be available. They will be filled on a first come basis.
5. All animals registered for the show must be in place by 9am on Friday, July 19, 2002, for the veterinarian to check. **No** dismantling of stalls/display or animal departures will be allowed until 9pm Sunday. Please plan accordingly.
6. Exhibitors must move their cars/trucks/trailers from the exhibit area to the designated parking area as soon as unloading is completed.
7. Farm displays/decorations are encouraged, as a prize will be awarded. It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to keep the exhibit area/stalls clean.
8. There will be a table set up for **general llama information only**; for example: llama fact sheets, GALA information, etc.

Fees/Expenses

\$10 per animal stall* (Fri., Sat., Sun.)

\$10 entry fee **per animal** (not per Class).

Make checks payable to: *Saratoga County Fair*

*No stall fee for exhibiting Tues., Weds. and Thurs. There are no shows on these days, but you are encouraged to come and bring animals for exhibition on Tues., Weds. and Thurs.

Classes must be paid for as entered and will be final. No refunds will be given without a vet certificate.

Schedule of Events

Friday, July 19

- 7-8:30am Arrival/set-up time
 9am Vet check
 11am-5pm Practice obstacle course, Lead-A-Llama and general public interaction. The public is invited and encouraged to watch and participate.

Saturday, July 20

- 9am Mandatory exhibitors' meeting
 10am **Showmanship**
 The emphasis on these is on the handler. It is a demonstration of the handler's ability to show his/her animal to its best advantage at halter. The judge will evaluate the handler's basic skills in: fitting, grooming, showing the animal, and style of presentation.
 Sub-junior youth (9 yrs & under)
 Junior showmanship (ages 10-18 yrs)
 Adult showmanship (ages 19 yrs & older)

Halter classes (immediately following Showmanship)

All llamas shall be presented for judging with a halter and a leadrope and no additional decorations. No farm/llama names should be displayed on the exhibitor during this show. Exhibitors should wear white shirt/blouses, dark pants/skirts and dark shoes.

Nursing llama mothers may not be accompanied in the ring by their babies. It is recommended that nursing mothers not be in these shows.

Llamas may be entered in only 1 halter class wool division.

We will pick an audience member to assist our judge in choosing the Best over-all female and male llama.
